# Session 1: "What is Diversity & Inclusion and the Challenges"

Dr. Lyndon's session focused on practical steps that individuals and organizations can take to promote diversity and inclusion in their respective environments, coupled with team exercises in this theme.





# Sessions 3 & 4: "POSH Law & POCSO Law"

After a lunch break from 1:15 PM to 2:00 PM, the program continued with sessions 3 and 4, which were facilitated by Dr. Jaya Mathew, Associate Professor, KJSIM, SVU. These sessions delved into the critical legal aspects of Preventing Sexual Harassment (POSH Law) and Protection of Children from Sexual Offenses (POCSO Law). Dr Mathew provided an in-depth understanding of these laws, their implications, and the necessary compliance measures.









The program concluded with closing remarks by Dr. Preeti Rawat, Director of FSDC. Dr. Rawat emphasized the importance of continuing conversations and efforts towards creating diverse, inclusive, and legally compliant educational and workplace environments.










# Faculty & Staff Development Centre Report on the FDP: The Power of Storytelling as an Effective Pedagogical Tool

Dated: 15 September 2023

The Faculty and Staff Development Centre (FSDC) organized a Faculty Development Program (FDP) session on "The Power of Storytelling as an Effective Pedagogical Tool" on 15th September 2023. The event commenced at 10:00 AM with an inaugural address by Dr. Preeti Rawat, Director of FSDC. Following the opening, Dr. Vidhya Thakkar, Assistant Professor at K J Somaiya Institute of Management, Somaiya Vidyavihar University, was introduced as the facilitator of the day. The total number of training hours for this FDP was 6 hours.



# **Session 1: Introduction to the World of Stories and Their Types**

The first session, led by Dr. Vidhya Thakkar, offered an insightful introduction to the world of storytelling and its various types. Participants gained an understanding of the science behind storytelling and its profound impact on learning and engagement. Dr. Thakkar set the stage for a day filled with exploration into the art of storytelling.







# Faculty & Staff Development Centre Report on the FDP: Employee Relations; Learning from Practice Dated: 22-23 September 2023

The Faculty and Staff Development Centre (FSDC) organized an FDP on 'Employee Relations; Learning from Practice', conducted from 22 - 23 September 2023. On 22nd September 2023, the event commenced at 10:00 AM with an inaugural address by Dr. Preeti Rawat, Director FSDC. The facilitator for this FDP is Mr. Meghanathan, DGM, Corporate HRS at BPCL. The total number of training hours for this FDP was 15 hours.

Mr. N Meganathan started by explaining that disciplinary action is a mechanism or tool that may be utilized when there is a deviation from established codes of conduct. It is intended for corrective action, although the outcome may be punitive. He highlighted the critical differences between disciplinary and criminal proceedings. Additionally, he shared the principles of natural justice to be upheld and elucidated the flowchart for disciplinary proceedings with the help of real-life cases that he had deftly handled over the last two decades. There were rich deliberations on the significance and guidelines relating to POSH -Prevention of Sexual Harassment of Women in the Workplace.

On 23rd September 2023, the session started at 10:00 AM. Mr. N Meganathan started by sharing how trade unions have come a long way since 1918. The topic of collective bargaining was explored in depth – from the need to stages to types and content of agreement. He shared how different organizations have benefitted from varied approaches. The day ended with a discussion on grievance redressal mechanisms and how progressive organizations like BPCL have a separate department called ESE (Employee Satisfaction Enhancement) that reports directly to the C&MD and aims to create an atmosphere that enables employees to thrive with a sense of pride. A special mention to Dr. Nikhil Mahindroo for providing inputs, for planning the FDP and this report.










Report on the FDP: National Education Policy 2020 Dated: 30 October 2023

A one-day seminar was jointly organised by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of K. J. Somaiya College of Science and Commerce, Seminar and Workshop Committee Jr. College in collaboration with Faculty & Staff Development Centre, Somaiya Vidyavihar University.

The Programme commenced with the traditional Campus prayer sung by Ms. Vidyanandi Iyer. Dr Pradnya Prabhu, Principal, K J Somaiya College of Arts and Science welcomed all the Dignitaries, Guest Speakers, and teachers from the Somaiya Vidyavihar campus. Further, Dr. Preeti Rawat, Director of FSDC, SVU, in her inaugural speech highlighted the vision, mission and objectives of organising the FDP for Junior college staff to gear up for the National Education Policy. She emphasised the need to equip ourselves to adopt the National Education Policy. She threw light on various aspects of NEP such as pedagogical improvements, modern education, and upskilling and reskilling. Her thought-provoking question, "Are we equipped to handle the new Digital Children" set the challenging journey ahead.

Dr. Pradnya Prabhu was the keynote speaker for the session. In her introductory session, she emphasized the need to include value systems while framing the curriculum. She expressed the need to change our classrooms into learning rooms and laboratories. The need to have a Holistic approach was highlighted. Her pondering thought, "If we teach today's students as we taught yesterday, we rob them of tomorrow" paved the upcoming discussion. The need for outcome-based education, appropriate instruction, pedagogy and assessment was expressed in detail. The total number of training hours for this FDP was 6 hours.







#### **Session 1: Vision behind NEP 2020 New Innovative Strategies**

Renowned educationist and visionary Dr, Kalpana Kharade, Adjunt Associate Professor, K J Somaiya College of Education, began her session with the fact that historical roots are found in the perspective of NEP 2020. In her refreshing and informative session, she unfolded the journey of various commissions such as the Mudliyar Commission and Kothari Commission. The contribution of Mahatma Gandhiji's 'Basic Education Policy' was underlined in the course of pre-independent time. First time in history, objectives such as the vocationalisation of education and diversification of courses were introduced as a source of livelihood. She also felt the need to update and upgrade our teachers to meet future challenges ahead. The need for experiential learning, digital learning, and fun learning were the takeaways of her informative Session. The session also focused on other important educational aspects such as NCF 2005, NCFTE 2009, the change of structure from 10+02+03 to 05+03+03+04, cultural diversity or inclusivity, and multi-disciplinary approach.

# Session 2: Overview of NEP, 2020 and Salient features of NEP

The next resource person, Dr Pooja Birwatkar, Incharge Principal at K J Somaiya College of Education, dealt with the overview and salient features of NEP. She also expressed her desire to read, study and analyse the draft of NCF minutely to know the guiding principles in implementing the NEP, 2020. The NEP has incorporated our age-old tradition of Pancha-Kosha Models and Pramanas. The need to tarnish the Silos Mentality is prominent in NEP, 2020. Dr. Bhirwatkar emphasises on the practical conflict between Idealism and Pragmatism in implementing NEP. She earnestly appealed to one and all with a positive message that the onus lies on all the teaching fraternity since we are content creators and curators. She believes that the NEP, 2020 will surely take us back to the roots. There was a heavy emphasis on "hard skills' that may leave children unprepared for the real "tests" in life. The breadth and depth in terms of school education was very well elaborated by the speaker.

#### **Session 3: Active Learning Strategies in light of NEP**

The next speaker, Dr Rupal Thakker, Associate Professor at K J Somaiya College of Education expressed the need to replace our traditional pedagogy with a modified teaching Pedagogy. Fun-oriented joyful Learning is the ultimate objective of NEP 2020. She also made it clear by stating the facts that activities like evolve, integrate, inquiry-driven, discovery-oriented, learner-centered, and discussion-based teaching and learning should be encouraged. Experiential learning and its related activities like field trips, case studies, mock trials, community service, real-life experiences, and project-based learning with art-integrated learning must go hand in hand. The journey from STEM to STEAM should be the sole purpose. Learn with Fun, Team-Teaching and sports integration are the key elements to be concentrated on. The session ended with fun activities.

# Session 4: Digital Pedagogy and Assessment

The next resource person, Dr. Hema Badhawkar enthralled the audience by taking them through a few tools and apps to make learning and teaching joyful. The concepts like VCB





and set inductions were explained with relevant examples. The digital assessment tools were shown for formative and summative assessment. The session went on very smoothly with hands-on training on tools like Nearpod, Kahoot, Quizizz, Desmos, Socrative App, Ani maker and Quizlet. Digital assessment tools can be very handy to evaluate students regularly. Offline tools like "Hot Potatoes" can be very effective in Rural and Tribal areas where there is a Network issue.

#### **Session 5: Teacher and Professional Development**

The last session by Ms. Takshashila Jadhav, Assistant Professor, K J Somaiya College of Education, began with an impressive thought that we need to think globally but act locally. The speaker highlighted her research paper findings on "Open Education for a Better World' which incorporated the idea of a holistic approach towards the community. Educational platforms like Coursera, Udemy, Swayam, LMS Platforms, Canvas etc were recommended for continuous Learning and interaction with the audience led the session to a discussion mode.

The Vote of Thanks was proposed by the Vice-Principal of Jr. College, Mrs. Savita Moghe followed by a quick feedback session where participants highlighted the strong takeaways of the session.








Day 2: October 31, 2023


Session II (3:45 - 5:15 PM): The session concentrated on qualitative data collection, with specific emphasis on interviewing and focus group discussions.






#### **Day 4: November 3, 2023**








#### Conclusion:










The event commenced at 10:00 AM with an inaugural address by Dr Preeti Rawat, Director of FSDC, followed by Dr Avani Oke, Principal, K J Somaiya College of Nursing, who set the tone for the FDP. Post the opening ceremony, Ms. Jovita Alex and Ms. Priyanka Godake, Clinical Instructors at K J Somaiya College of Nursing, were introduced as the facilitators of the day. The total number of training hours for this FDP was 6 hours.



#### **Session 1: Introduction to CPR**

The first session, led by Ms.Jovita Alex, was initiated with a comprehensive introduction to CPR, outlining its significance and role in emergency situations. This session provided participants with a foundational understanding of CPR principles. She also emphasized the various steps one must take in an emergency.







#### **Session 2: Artificial External Defibrillator (AED)**

The FDP session concluded with closing remarks and positive feedback given by various participants.







# Report on the FDP: Grant Writing for Funded Research Dated: 4 December 2023

The Faculty and Staff Development Centre (FSDC) organized a Faculty Development Program (FDP) session on "Grant Writing for Funded Research" on 4 December 2023. The event commenced at 10:00 AM with an inaugural address by Dr. Preeti Rawat, Director of FSDC. Dr. Achala Danayat Director of SIRAC and Dr. Navjeet Kaur, Coordinator Research Promotion of SIRAC, spoke a few words to set the tone for the upcoming sessions. Following the opening, the facilitators took over the stage to start the session. The facilitators for this session were Dr. Sunita Shailajan, Freelance Technical Expert and Dr. Sasikumar Menon, Director of TDM labs, Mumbai. The total number of training hours for this FDP was 6 hours.



#### **Session 1: Introduction to Various Funding Agencies**

The session commenced with an overview of the initiation of a research project, emphasizing key aspects such as planning, proposal design, project timelines, and financial considerations. Participants gained insights into different funding agencies and their varied approaches to research funding.









Session 2: Life Cycle of a Funded Research Project

The facilitators delved into the structural components of a research proposal, using various live examples, to illustrate the life cycle of a funded research project. Practical aspects, including presenting research progress and documenting annual reports, were covered. An overview of an upcoming interactive session was also provided.



Session 3: Project Planning and Proposal Writing - Group activity

Following a lunch break from 1:15 PM to 2:00 PM, the facilitators divided the participants into groups of six, on the basis of their subject area background. They were each provided with a research paper and they had to come up with a grant proposal similar to the research paper problem. 90 mins were provided to all teams to prepare various aids to present their grant proposals.









## Session 4: Project Planning and Proposal Writing - Feedback Session

Participants presented their project plans and proposals, followed by constructive feedback from the facilitators. The session aimed to enhance grant proposal presentation skills and refine project proposals. The best two teams were provided with a small token of appreciation.







#### Report on the SDP: Enhancing Software Skills in Python Programming

Dated: 4 December 2023 - 11 December 2023

The Faculty and Staff Development Centre (FSDC) organized a Staff Development Program (FDP) session on "Enhancing Software Skills in Python Programming" from 4 December 2023 to 11 December 2023, in collaboration with the K J Somaiya College of Engineering. The event commenced at 11:00 AM with an inaugural address by Prof. Preeti Rawat, Director of FSDC and Dr. Suresh Ukarande, Principal KJSCE spoke a few words to set the tone for the upcoming sessions. The facilitators were internal faculty members as this SDP was aimed to train the lab assistants of KJSCE. Following the opening, the facilitators took over. The total training hours for this SDP was 21 hours.





Session I & II that focused on developing problem-solving skills, understanding Python programming features, and mastering execution processes. Session III provided hands-on experience with various Python IDEs, command interfaces, and graphical interfaces. The concise sessions aimed at equipping participants with foundational knowledge and practical skills for effective Python programming.

#### Day 2 was on 5 Dec 2023

The 1st half of the day's session mainly focused on covering essential concepts related to data types and structures in Python. Participants were introduced to Python's data types, including whitespace, code block indentation, and key considerations for variables. Practical sessions involved hands-on experience with operators, basic math functions, and string manipulations. In the afternoon session, the facilitator delved into data structures such as tuples, lists, dictionaries, sets, and arrays. Participants engaged in practical exercises involving the conversion methods of these data structures.









#### **Day 3 was on 7 Dec 2023**

In the morning session, the facilitator covered decision-making and function concepts in Python. Participants were introduced to if statements, including if, if-else, else-if, and nested if, along with repetition structures using while and for loops. The session also explored function definition, parameter handling, and types of arguments, including required, keyword, default, and variable-length arguments. In the afternoon session, advanced concepts were presented, including pass statements in functions, nested functions, and the scope of variables. The session continued with an exploration of recursion, lambda functions, and the use of filter and map functions. Through practical exercises, participants gained hands-on experience in implementing these advanced features.





#### Day 4 was on 8 Dec 2024

The morning session, held from 10:30 am to 12:00 pm, focused on Python exception and file handling. Participants delved into understanding errors, including runtime, compile-time, and logical errors, with an emphasis on exception handling and assertions. The session also covered types of files in Python, file opening modes, text file operations like writing and appending, and introduced working with binary files, addressing file exceptions for a





comprehensive overview. The concise session equipped participants with essential skills in managing exceptions and handling various file types in Python.





#### Day 5 was on 11 Dec 2023

The morning session, from 10:30 am to 12:00 pm, centered on Python packages, offering participants an introduction, installation guidance, and practical use cases. #### **Session 1: Technical Analysis**



#### Report on the FDP: Teaching Excellence for Management Faculty

**Dated: 17 -19 June 2024** 

The Faculty & Staff Development Centre (FSDC) in association with K J Somaiya Institute of Management, organised a three day online Faculty Development Program (FDP) on "Teaching Excellence for Management Faculty" from 17 – 19 June, 2024. The FDP was facilitated by Prof. Ranjan Banerjee, Vice Chancellor of Nayata University and Prof. Leena Chatterjee, Professor of Organisational Behaviour, BITSoM. The session was inaugurated at 9 AM starting with the campus prayer, followed by the welcome speech by Dr. Raman Ramachandran, Director K J Somaiya Institute of Management (KJSIM) and address by Prof. Preeti Rawat, Director, FSDC, SVU. The total number of training hours for this FDP was 22 hours, spread across 3 days.

#### Session I: 09:10 - 10:30 am

# **Expectations Sharing: What It Takes to Be an Effective Teacher**

This session began with faculty introductions and a discussion to understand the key expectations of the group. The facilitators emphasised refreshing the original motivation for becoming a teacher and developing a broad understanding of teaching effectiveness and its link to the learner's journey. The difference between immediate short-term impact and long-term effectiveness in teaching was also explored.

#### Session II: 10:45 am - 12:15 pm

#### Designing and Upgrading a Course: What Is Involved in Creating a Course

Participants learned about the process involved in creating a course outline and what constitutes a good course outline. An exercise was conducted where participants critiqued several real course outlines. For this session, participants were required to bring a recent course outline they had been involved with.

### Session III: 12:20 - 01:30 pm

# The Engaged Classroom: What Does It Take to Make a Session Engaging

This session focused on the levels of audience engagement in a class and what it takes to move up these levels. Various caselets of different audience and subject contexts were discussed, and approaches to engagement in each situation were explored.

Session IV: 02:15 - 04:15 pm Teaching with Simulations





Participants were introduced to the concept of teaching with simulations. Various simulation techniques and their application in the classroom were discussed, providing a hands-on experience for the faculty.

# Session V: 04:30 - 06:00 pm Tools of Engagement - 1

This session covered various tools of engagement, each demonstrated in practice with feedback. Topics included setting context through faculty introduction, voice modulation, and the use of visual aids. Mock teaching briefs and briefs for the simulated teaching session on day three were distributed.



Day 2: June 18, 2024

Session I: 09:00 am - 12:00 pm

Other Tools of Engagement: Role Plays, Videos

The use of role plays and videos in teaching was the focus of this session. Participants learned about the design, briefing, debriefing, and integration of role plays with concepts. The selection, briefing, facilitation, and debriefing of videos in teaching were also discussed.

# Session II: 12:15 - 01:15 pm Asking and Answering Questions

This session addressed different audience situations and how to frame good questions. It also covered how to react when responses are not as expected and the preparation for directed questioning. Specific participant situations were discussed to understand how they could be handled effectively.

Session III: 02:30 - 04:45 pm

Technology in Teaching: Offline and Online





Participants explored the role of Gen AI and its positive impact on various aspects of the teaching process. The current capabilities of technology were reviewed, and a variety of situations were analysed to see how Gen AI can be a positive enabler in teaching.

Session IV: 05:00 - 06:00 pm **Teaching with Simulations** 

A continuation from Day 1, this session provided further insights into teaching with simulations, with additional examples and practical applications discussed.

Session V: 04:30 - 06:00 pm **Preparation for Day 3 (in Groups)** 

Participants were divided into small groups to prepare for the group-based mock teaching sessions. This involved writing clear objectives, designing mechanisms to achieve these objectives engagingly, and selecting and executing delivery approaches that suit the faculty's personality and style. The importance of preparation and delivery was emphasised.



Day 3: June 19, 2024

Session I: 09:00 am - 01:15 pm **Mock Teaching and Feedback** 

Groups delivered 30-minute teaching sessions, followed by 15 minutes of feedback. This hands-on practice allowed participants to apply what they had learned in previous sessions.

Session II: 02:30 - 03:45 pm **Mock Teaching and Feedback** 

A continuation of the morning session, additional groups delivered their teaching sessions, followed by feedback.





Session III: 04:00 - 05:00 pm Integration

Key takeaways from the teaching sessions were summarised. The discussion focused on 'the teacher as a learner' and how participants could build from this session to their own journey in teaching excellence.

#### Feedback and Closing Ceremony: 05:00 - 05:15 pm

The program concluded with a feedback session and a closing ceremony, where participants shared their experiences and reflections on the FDP, highlighting the skills and insights gained over the three days.








